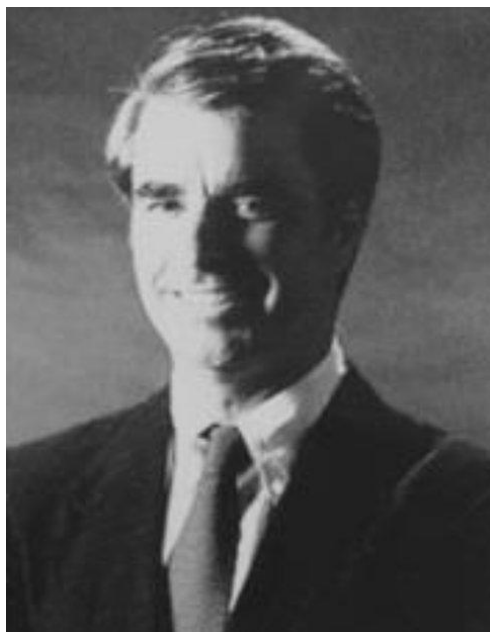


John K. Garvey

John Garvey became President and CEO of Petroleum, Inc. in 1992, after which, the company grew nearly five-fold in eight years in net asset value. Although he has now sold most of the oil and gas operations of Petroleum, Inc., he has engaged in successful oil and gas exploration and production projects in the Mid-continent, the Rockies, Alaska, and Siberia. Additionally, he diversified his experience with significant Southwestern real estate ventures, including acquiring the Wickenburg Inn in Arizona.

John received degrees from the Yale University School of Management, two Master's degrees from the University of Denver, and a B.A. from the University of Kansas. He has completed other educational programs, including from the Harvard Business School, Stanford Business School, Wharton, and MIT. He is a founding member of The Madison Council at the Library of Congress.

In the political realm, he served on the Kansas Governor's Trade Delegation to the PRC in 1986 and the Council on the Constitution in Washing, D.C. in 1998. He was active in advocating and consulting with the George W. Bush Administration,

other public policy makers, and think tanks on a project advising developing countries in the War on Terrorism.

He is the co-founder and executive director of Family Businesses of America, which lobbied and provided testimony for modification of (and eventual repeal of) the Death Tax (Estate Tax) for America's 11+ million family businesses. He currently serves as a member of the Board of Trustees for The Institute of World Politics.
