

Albert Hogoboom

1934 - 2015



Albert's life began June 9, 1934, in El Dorado, the son of Virgil Carl and Mary (Cundell) Hogoboom. He is the founder and owner of Albert Hogoboom Oil Field Trucking. Albert's contributions to the El Dorado community are almost too numerous to count. He served on the board of directors at Susan B. Allen Hospital and was instrumental in helping Butler Community College construct their new stadium; he was a member of the Patmos Masonic Lodge #97, and the Kansas Oil and Gas Association.

He enjoyed traveling in his RV with the Kansas Twisters Motor Homes and especially loved his quarter horses. Albert was a member of the Kansas Quarter Horse Racing Association and was the proud owner of the top quarter horse in the county- his beloved Shogun. Albert supported the Kansas Oil Museum, USD 490 Partner in Education, Butler Community College, and so many other worthy organizations and sincerely believed in giving back to his hometown. He was a board member of Kansas Motor Carriers Association (KMCA) and was involved in legislation that greatly affected the oilfield trucking industry.
